#### **Assessments and Reports**

Over the last couple of weeks, our year 4 children have completed their multiplication check assessment. This was assessing their quick recall of their times tables, something that is crucial to support their mental maths when solving problems and calculations. Our year 1



children completed their Phonics screen check. This check assessed the children's understanding of reading real and nonsense words using the wide range of phonics sounds they have been taught using our RWi phonics programme. Results of these assessments will be shared with parents in our end of year reports that will be sent home with all the children on **Friday 30th June**.




#### Dear Children and Families,

To order, please send cash in an envelope to school. Please send details of child's name and which book(s) you would like. We can then ensure they are ordered in time for the event!



#### POO! IS THAT YOU? (paperback) Illustrated by Nicola O'Byrne £6.30


Lenny the Lemur is on holiday in the Amazon rainforest. He's just settling down for a nice snooze, when a very yucky smell wafts past. Poo-ie!

## HOW RUDE! HOW SELFISH! HOW SELFISH (paperback) Illustrated by Olivier Tallec £7.20 each



Lotte snips puppets by the light of the moon and longs for change. A Cinderella retelling with a difference, where creativity and determination create happy endings.


This story has a fold-out centre fold with peep through pages.

An arctic tern sets off on the world's longest animal migration, passing other incredible creatures on their journey south for winter.


Perfect for young animal lovers, with a map and double-page spread of non-fiction facts at the end.



A beautiful, powerful and uplifting story, exploring the complicated emotions we feel when someone we love is diagnosed with a serious illness.


Sensitively tackling the tough subject of illness with authentic and empathetic tenderness.
