Sporting events

Unfortunately, due to our forest school sessions with Devon Wildlife Trust/year 5 Bikeability sessions that were already booked into our calendar some time ago, we were unable to send our year 5 and 6 children to the Athletics event earlier this week. We have two sporting events planned for next week – on Thursday our key stage 2 **Netball** team will be taking part in a festival of Hope tournament at Tavistock College and on Friday children from year 4,5 and 6 will take part in a **tag rugby** festival at South Tawton. **Your child will come home with a letter today if they have been selected to represent the school in either of these events.**


Music Performance


