Swimming Lessons



We will be having our annual swimming lessons in the summer term at Aqua Stars Academy of Swimming, Ruby Oak Park, Brandis Corner. The children will receive a 6 week course of swimming lessons as part of their PE curriculum. The very experienced teachers will ensure that all the children will be challenged and improve over the six weeks.


The course will begin with Oketor swimming from Friday 21st April and will finish on Friday 26th May. Littlemoor children will begin lessons from Friday 9th June and finish Friday 14th July

The lessons will last 1hr and be held between 1.15 – 2.15 pm. The children will be transported by bus, leaving school after lunch and will return before the end of the school day.

The school have heavily subsidised the payments to cover the cost of the coach and swimming instructors. The contribution for each child required towards the lessons is £21.80. Payment/consent must be made in the 'Payments' section of School Gateway by Friday 24th March 2023.

Children will need to bring in a swim bag, their trunks/costume, a towel and goggles if they wear them. Hats are not compulsory but long hair must be tied back. Please could the children can also bring a drink and a healthy snack for after their session.

Oketor Forest School Session

This week with Sarah, we looked at three different types of soil. We found out that in a teaspoon of soil there are more bugs and nutrients than there are humans in the world.

We compared soil from the school field and compost from our compost bin and we found a major difference between them. The soil from the field had a couple of worms and beetles in it but the compost had lots of worms digesting the disintegrating fruit waste – the stench was terrible!

Sara told us that the worms we found at Boasley Cross, were two different species: composting worms and earth worms. The composting worms were pinkish/red in colour whereas the earth worms were more of a tan colour.

We learned from Sarah that humans wouldn't exist right now if we didn't have our precious soil because the soil provides us with the right resources to grow crops.




Ethan for consolidating his learning by asking questions that deepen his understanding, particularly in maths.
