Oketor Forest School

Sarah brought in rope and tarpaulin sheets for us to make dens with today - it was great fun and we got to work with our friends.

Our instructions were:

- 2) We could only use one tarpaulin sheet
- 3) We could only use one length of rope



Sarah said we could use

sticks or anything else that we found to help us and she advised us about what sort of different knots would be useful.

After we had built our dens we all went round and evaluated each others, looking at what we would do differently next time and why.

Littlemoor Design & Technology

During our DT learning, Littlemoor have been exploring how we define what is a fruit and what is a vegetable. The children will be designing and making their own smoothie next week and on Wednesday we got to sample three different shop bought smoothies so that we could decide whether we enjoyed the combination of flavours that had been used.





The children then got to taste lots of different fruits and vegetables, individually, to decide whether they would like to include them in their own smoothie recipe. The children discussed how each of the different fruits and vegetables tasted: Were they sweet or sour?

Was the texture smooth or crunchy? What combinations would I enjoy in my smoothie? I

think it was fair to say that they all enjoyed it.



Cookery Club

This was our last Cookery Club session and we made chocolate muffins. Instead of me talking about how impressed I was and sharing my thoughts, I thought I'd ask the children what they have thought of their experience...

Lois has explored different ways to build her own resilience.


