

How special to be able to celebrate and spend the day with you. Normally, being an author means sitting at home in my pyjamas with my imaginary friends and my dog, Hope. 
P.P.S. I will be travelling to see you in my authormobile. Please can I park on your playground? Save me a spot!




### Please come and help!
