
Years 3&4 Tag Rugby Festival On Tuesday 4th October the children in years 3 & 4 have



'Apple Tales' Apple Pressing Workshop

As our school garden has produced such a bumper crop off apples, FOBCS have kindly covered the cost of an apple pressing experience

for the whole school. During the afternoon workshop on **Wed 12**th **October**, the children will learn to make apple juice using choppers, a scratter & a barrel press. As the apples are pressed stories will be told celebrating the magic of apples from different cultures and the seasonal cycle of blossom, pollination & fruit.
