

After every ten reading sessions, our Silver Readers can down load a certificate which can be displayed in their schools. By linking readers to older people by telephone, we aim to combat the loneliness and isolation that can be felt by older people, to create intergenerational relationships and to offer children a richer reading experience. BOOK DAY Today, children and staff dressed as book characters in celebration of all of the wonderful stories that have been read and enjoyed by us all not only individually but also as a class during our Guided Reading and English learning.

Children were invited to take part in a Book Character Treasure Hunt, organised by the School Librarians. Characters were hidden high and low in the outside learning environment and the children enjoyed searching, in all the crevices of the school grounds, seeking out some of their favourite personalities from well-known fictional stories.





Oketor children have taken part in a Potato Print World Book Day activity where they collaborated as a class to create their own short-story. Their beautifully creative work – linked to their current learning – will be printed and transformed into a book that can adorn bookshelves and be read again and again.







Littlemoor linked their maths learning today to a well-known character, the BFG. Year 1 and 2 children consolidated their knowledge of measurement by following instructions and measures to draw out the BFG on the playground whilst Reception children worked in reverse – they created a chalk drawing of the BFG on the playground and then used metre sticks to measure him.
