Dear Parents/Carers

I want to begin this week's newsletter by thanking the children and staff for the resilience and resourcefulness they have shown again this week. With more staff shortages due to Covid, I have spent this week teaching at Northlew. I was able to pop into school today to see the children and staff. It was lovely to see the great learning the children have been developing and the enthusiasm to share with me the learning they have been exploring this week.

Mrs Ogborne and the School Council have been busy this week and have put together a wonderful display of the events that the children have been involved in and have run this academic year. It is great to see our School Council Leaders develop in their confidence to make great decisions and the impact these have on our school and wider community.

Our Year Four parents will have received information about the multiplication tables check earlier this week. I hope the booklet will give you all the relevant information you need regarding the check that will take place in June. Mrs Winter will continue, as part of her daily maths sessions, to practise timetables with the children. Please can we ask that all children in Oketor also continue to practise their multiplication tables regularly to support their maths learning in the classroom.

Our new 'forest school' shed has arrived and is waiting to be put together by the Moorland Hub maintenance team over the next few weeks. The shed will house our new waterproofs and wellies, as well as the tools and equipment needed for our outdoor learning. The shed will be a great asset to our fantastic outdoor provision and provide space for the children to change, keeping the mud out of our classrooms!

Next Wednesday, as part of the Trust AWE projects, we have a team coming to school to work on clearing the pond and tidying up the area around the pond. They are asking if any parents are available to support this project, so please come along to the school on Wednesday afternoon from 1pm and offer anytime that you have spare. The pond area will be used to enhance the curriculum and will enable both classes to develop their outdoor provision. We are very grateful to the Trust AWE team for prioritising the

developments in our fantastic outside space and we look forward to our children being able to use the space to develop their learning further.

### **OCRA Cross-Country Events 2022**







Ethan has shown respect by joining intervention groups with a positive attitude and fantastic engagement.


Jowan has shown respectfulness towards our equipment in Littlemoor playground and made sure teachers knew about any unsafe or broken equipment. Well done Jowan!
