Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome back to the second half of the Spring term. I hope you all had a lovely half term break and managed to stay safe during the storms at the beginning of the holidays.

The children have returned to school enthusiastic and ready to learn. This half term, the children in Littlemoor will be investigating the topic of 'Explorers' in history and researching the wide range of materials and their purpose in their science 'Building Things' topic. In Oketor, the children have already begun their science topic of 'Diet and Lifestyle' and will be exploring 'human migration' in their geography learning over this half term. If you have any artefacts or information that you feel would benefit these topics, then please do speak to your child's class teacher.


courses available to parents free of charge, please see details attached to this newsletter.

Outdoor Development

Next week, we are having our new forest school storage shelter built. This shelter will provide a space to store our new school waterproofs and wellies; also enabling us to have all the equipment and resources needed for Mrs Simmons to engage the children in their weekly outdoor learning and forest school sessions. We are also having the fencing around Littlemoor replaced and hope when the weather improves, we



can get some fresh paint on the sheds in the playground so the children can use these for developing role play areas.



New Phonics Program

This week, staff began their training to implement our new phonics scheme, Read, Write Inc. All staff across the school will access all the training available, including training sessions with other colleagues across the Trust. Assessments have already begun to arrange the children into appropriate

reading groups, with reading to begin using the new scheme. We hope to run some information sessions for our parents in the Summer term, to enable parents to support their children with reading development at home. 




On **Monday 7th March from 2pm – 4pm** we will be starting to transform the pond in the school grounds.
