## Comic Relief / Red Nose Day

Comic Relief day is on 15<sup>th</sup> March. The School Council children have met together to plan events for the day. They are inviting children to wear something red and pay £1 as a donation to the charity. They would also like to hold a Bake Sale at playtime, so we would appreciate contributions of cakes to sell to the other children. School Councillors will be painting red noses for a 10p donation. ## Jewellery in PE Sessions:

Our risk assessments, in line with national PE and Sport guidance, state that any jewellery, including earrings, should not be worn during PE or sport activities. In addition, long hair should be tied up and appropriate footwear worn. Historical practice of 'taping' earrings is no longer considered an appropriate safety mechanism and not a satisfactory mitigation for the risk of injury associated with earrings in sport.

We are aware that this policy has not been strictly enforced in recent months and years, which was an error on our part and for which we apologise. The safety and wellbeing of our children is, and always will be, our main priority. Therefore, having been made aware our procedure has not been robustly followed, we will be enforcing this from now on.

Children should not wear any jewellery, including earrings, during PE and Sport. Staff will be happy to assist children in removing earrings and storing them safely if required. Additionally, long hair should be tied up. General guidance states that newly pierced ears should not have earrings removed for 6 weeks. We therefore ask you to carefully consider when you arrange for your children's ears to be pierced so they don't have to miss any PE sessions.
