Information from our SENDCo, Mrs Pickett Jones

DiAS (Devon, Information, Advice and Support) supports children and young people aged 0-25 with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND), and their parents and carers.

These are the important things to know about our service:

• **It's confidential.** We don't share anything you tell us, unless it's a safeguarding issue or you have given us permission.

• **It's impartial.** We aim to give you information about the options available, then it's up to you to make the decisions. We won't promote one option over another, unless there's no alternative. Although we are part of Devon County Council, we are separate from their other SEND services and departments. You can find out more by reading our <u>impartiality policy</u>.

- It's free of charge.
- We talk directly to parents, carers, guardians, children and young people. We can also talk to professionals if parents or young people give their permission.

• **Anyone can access it.** If you have communication difficulties or English as a second language, we will always do our best to arrange the right support. Our webpages can all be translated into languages other than English, using <u>Reachdeck</u>. We can also produce information in large print if you need it. Please contact us if you need information in other formats or need more help.

• **It's based on the law.** All DiAS staff who work directly with parent carers, children and young people have training about the legal areas of SEND support, EHC Plans and issues such as exclusion.

• It operates on a first come first served basis unless you need to speak to us urgently because of a serious issue or short legal timescale.

• It's for anyone living in Devon. If you live in Torbay or Plymouth there are <u>Information Advice and</u> <u>Support services</u> for your area. We are offering 3 free training sessions this term:

Listening to your child's views 10 – 11.30am, Tuesday 21 November 2023 Demystifying SEND 10 – 11.30am, Tuesday 28 November 2023 Education Health and Care (EHC) plan reviews 1pm – 2.30pm, Monday 4 December 2023 See our website to book a place

Dear Parents

Following our latest FOBCS meeting, the committee has agreed to undertake fundraising for new outdoor play equipment. The existing equipment at Boasley has now been officially condemned, having reached the end of its life in school and therefore our only option is to replace the equipment. We believe that this equipment is vital for our children's health and wellbeing and therefore we will be putting our combined efforts in trying to raise enough funds to achieve this. The fundraising total is approximately £15,000 to achieve something along similar lines to what we already have. Mr Hill has requested that the equipment is produced from composite plastic to ensure that it has a longer lifespan than timber. Due to our exposed location, this seems very sensible. It does mean that the fundraising target is a little larger to accommodate slightly more expensive materials. Our school community is always helpful and generous in supporting FOBCS events in different ways, but this year we are asking you to help us in any way possible. The committee is currently in the process of looking at grant applications and asking the wider community for support. We will continue with our normal events, such as refreshments and raffles after events, Bags 2 School and an Easter Bingo, but we are proposing some additional events such as an online auction later in the year. We are in the process of writing to the wider community for support and if you know of anyone (individual, family, organisation or business) who you feel may be able to help us in one way or another, please do speak to me initially. We are keen not to bombard people with multiple requests for help, so I am acting as a central point to collate things. We are in the process of setting up a funding page and will share the details with you as soon as it is up and running so you are able to share for smaller donations.

We are open to any suggestions/ help that you are able to offer! The first request will be to provide raffle prizes for the Christmas raffles we will be running at our Christmas play's this year. We will send out details of who to pass donations to and when by very shortly!

Since my time at Boasley as a parent, I have always been bowled over by how active FOBCS are and how generous everyone is in various ways to our school community, so I am confident that this amount is achievable and that our children will once again be able to enjoy the benefit of a superb outdoor play area.
