Maths Support

The Maths materials we subscribe to have a wealth of support materials which are free to access. Try clicking on the links below to explore them. Children should also all be familiar with either Times Table Rock Stars or Numbots. Remember, these can be accessed at home as well as within school time.

- 1. One-Minute maths <u>1-minute maths app | White Rose Maths (whiteroseeducation.com)</u> We encourage you all to download this app and use it as much as possible to support rapid recall of number facts.
- 2. Times Tables Rock Stars all children have access to TTRS. Use it whenever you can to build up fluency with these key facts.
- 3. Home learning videos. <u>Maths home learning | Home learning | White Rose Maths</u> (whiteroseeducation.com) White Rose still has a full suite of home learning videos which were made available during Covid. These are freely available on their website and are between 5 – 10 minutes.

Cool Milk

We are in the process of arranging delivery of milk under the 'Cool Milk' scheme for children in Pre School and Early Years. This is available to children, free of charge until they reach 5 years old. A form will be passed to eligible children for parents to return by **Wednesday 23rd January** please. Milk can also be supplied to children over 5 years old at a cost of around £14 per term. Please ask for a form if you would like your child to be included if they are over 5 years old.

Singing Teacher

We are pleased to say that Mrs Hardy (Lottie's mum) is offering after school singing lessons for children from Y2 upwards. If your child would be interested in having regular lessons, please email admin@boasleyprimary.org.uk so we are able to assess how best we are able to manage the sessions. Children in receipt of Pupil Premium can receive support to subsidise these lessons.
