


#### Spotlight on Oketor:



Oketor have been loving the texts we are using for Book Club and English at the moment. We are reading 'The Explorer, by Katherine Rundell in book club. We are following a great story but also learning a lot about survival in the rainforest at the same time. We're not sure about the idea of toasting tarantulas! Freya commented today about how she would like to meet the children in the book so she could ask them all about the adventure they had. In English, to support our Ancient Greek topic in History, we

have been reading The Odyssey. Once again, the children have become completely absorbed in the text and have followed every twist and turn. Next week they will be writing their own Greek Myth, incorporating ideas from the text we have shared – including some of the gruesome mythical creatures Odysseus encountered.



#### <u>Willow</u>

The willow tunnel and dome on the field have been left to their own devices for a few years and are somewhat overgrown! Last weekend, we made a start on beginning to bring it back under control but there is still plenty to do. If you are able to spare any time to help with this, my friend, Sarah, who has experience in projects like this, will be happy to work with you on Friday 9<sup>th</sup> February from 1.30 - 3.30. She is giving her time free of charge, so it would be great if we can pull together so the children have some more pleasing willow structures to play in this summer.

#### Wellbeing day

On Monday next week, we will be celebrating Mental Health and Wellbeing week by spending the morning with the children engaged in a number of forest school activities followed, in the afternoon, by the whole school treat, due to the fact they have reached the top of the behaviour thermometer. The children have expressed their opinions about

the format for the afternoon and we have accommodated as many of these as possible. Children will be able to dress in their own clothes and we invite pupils to bring a voluntary contribution of £1 for the 'Place2be' charity which supports children's mental health. As most of the morning activities will take place in the forest school area, it may be advisable to send in waterproof trousers and boots (especially if the weather is not looking good).

#### <u>Secret Gardener</u>

When I arrived at school on Thursday morning, I noticed the pots had been cleared out and replenished with new plants. Thank you, Mrs Turner, this is greatly appreciated! The EYFS children have also been planting bulbs and, much to Mrs Lethbridge's delight, they are coming up. You will spot them around the front of the school too.

- 2. Times Tables Rock Stars all children have access to TTRS. Use it whenever you can to build up fluency with these key facts.
- 3. Home learning videos. <u>Maths home learning | Home learning | White Rose Maths</u> (whiteroseeducation.com) White Rose still has a full suite of home learning videos which were made available during Covid. These are freely available on their website and are between 5 – 10 minutes.

## Cool Milk



We have made progress with arranging the delivery of milk under the 'Cool Milk' scheme for children in Pre School and Early Years. This is available to children, free of charge until they reach 5 years old. Milk can also be supplied to children over 5 years old at a cost of around £14 per term. Thank you to those who have already returned registration forms. Please ask if you would like your child to be included if they are over 5 years old. Deliveries should be starting after half term.


## <u>Uniform</u>

A polite reminder to everyone about school uniform. Here is the extract from the prospectus just to remind everyone. Can we also ask that, on PE days, children wear navy or black shorts, jogging bottoms or leggings and a plain white T shirt (or one with the school emblem on).

"The School Uniform consists of **navy-blue sweatshirt**, **white polo shirt (with fleece jacket in cold** weather) with Boasley Primary School logo, for all the children. Girls should wear **black or grey** skirts or trousers and boys wear **black or grey trousers**. Children should wear sensible flat-heeled black shoes, not open-toed, to ensure good protection for feet and to avoid accidents while playing."



Federation of Children's Book Groups - Children's Book Award Voting

The 5 schools in the Moorland hub have been taking part in the Shortlisting voting of the 'Books for Young Children' Category of the National Children's Book Awards, run by the Federation of Children's Book Groups (FCBG). This is the only national book award that is voted for entirely by children – start to finish and has been running for over 40 years! The shortlisting voting has just come to a close and between the 5 schools we have submitted over 800 votes via our local group – Plymouth CBG. Thank you so much to the younger children within our schools for engaging in the voting. The next round of voting will start soon, once the Top 10 books (across 3 categories) are announced. This is a really fabulous opportunity for our small schools to be involved with and we hope to engage with the testing of some of the older categories in the future.
