It has been lovely to see how the children have grasped each opportunity and changed to include their own ideas.

Parents Forum

Thank you to all the parents who were able to come to school for the first Parents' Forum of the year. We had a good discussion about several things, from reading books to community groups. It was brilliant to have some input from everyone who was able to attend. One of the items we talked about was drinks available to children in class. We know how important it is to stay hydrated during the school day, but we are also conscious of the impact that drinking squash has on our teeth when it is consumed little and often. We will be encouraging, rather than insisting, that children have just water in the bottle they bring into class and to have squash, if they would like some, in a bottle for lunch and break times. If bringing two bottles causes a problem, we have plenty of cups available at school.

DCC Autism and Us Parent Support Programme

Support for parents/carers of Devon's primary and secondary children who are either on the autism waiting list or who have received a diagnosis of autism.

Our free Autism and Us programme and themed workshops are for parents/carers of Devon primary and secondary school children, pre or post-diagnosis. We offer access for families of children and young people who are currently on the autism assessment pathway, as well as families of children and young people who have received an autism diagnosis.

Autism and Us parent programme (four week course)

Attending the Autism and Us parent programme gives you an opportunity to develop your understanding of autism and look at practical solutions to managing and supporting your child's presenting needs.

The programme is made up of four weekly 'live online' sessions (each approximately two hours long) related to the following topics or themes:

Spring term 2024 workshops

Monday 5 February 2024 10am to 12pm	Introducing Devon Information Advice and Support and Parent Carer Forum Devon This workshop will introduce the Devon Information Advice and Support (DIAS): who we are and what we do. We will look at how you and your child or young person can engage with the decisions that impact you, including how to get best out of conversations and meetings about your child's support, how to share your views and those of your child, and understanding your options and legal rights. We will take you through our information and resources that may be relevant for you and your child or young person and talk through how and when it might be most helpful to link with our service. You will also be able to find out more about Parent Carer Forum Devon, how we work and how you can get involved.
Wednesday 7 February	Autism and girls This workshop seek to explore the background of the diagnosis of autism in girls and why historically the female / male ratio has been significantly lower. We explore the key characteristics of girls with autism including areas such

9.30am to 12pm	as possible masking, communication, social understanding and associated vulnerability. Subsequently we seek to highlight key approaches / strategies which aim to help to support autistic girls within the home / family context.
Monday 26 February 10am to 12pm	Autism – communication (verbal – support strategies) This workshop explores communication strengths and differences and how these may impact on daily life for verbal children and young people and families. It will support in exploring strategies to support child and young people around the following areas: how adult use of language can support and provide structure, self-advocating through communication, how visuals can support communication and sharing communication needs with the wider family/support network.
Wednesday 28 February 10am to 12pm	Autism and demand avoidance This workshop seeks to explore the key characteristics of the extreme demand avoidance profile while outlining the diagnostic background and how these fits into the strengths and needs of autistic children and young people. Subsequently it explores the characteristics of this profile and how it may manifest through a child's behaviour. A range of strategies / approaches are highlighted with the aim of supporting children and young people in the home with an emphasis on an individualised approach which allows for the prioritising of goals to support family life.
Tuesday 5 March 10am to 12pm	Autism – communication (pre or non-verbal – support strategies) This workshop will consider both language and communication and what is meant by a Total Communication approach. We will also consider practical strategies to support pre and non-verbal children and young people communicate through a focus on means, reasons and opportunity. Please note, this workshop is not appropriate for supporting children who are experiencing situational mutism.
Wednesday 13 March 10am to 12pm	Autism – vulnerability and online safety This workshop will explore some of the vulnerabilities that ALL children and young people may experience growing up. But this workshop will specifically shine a lens on how a child or young person with autism's profile may lead them to respond in different ways through their own developmental journeys. A range of approaches, strategies and supportive links will also be offered to support family life.
Monday 18 March 10am to 12pm	Autism – managing stress and anxiety This workshop will explore our understanding of anxiety and how autistic children and young people may experience and express their own anxiety. The workshop will also consider and provide how we can support and reduce their anxiety within the home / family context through a range of approaches and strategies.
Tuesday 26 March 09.30am to 12pm	Autism – sensory processing and integration This workshop will explore the 8 senses, sensory integration and how this may affect how autistic children and young people respond to the environment and sensations they are feeling. It aims to raise awareness of sensory processing differences that may impact on an autistic person's life and provide a range of approaches and strategies to support through sensory regulation approaches within the home / family context.
