Dear Parents/Carers

Following the letter sent out earlier this week regarding a positive COVID case in Oketor class, I would like to update you with the measures we already have in place across the school. We have always had the building well ventilated and good hygiene measures have always been in place since the beginning of the pandemic. This of course will continue with regular hand washing/sanitising throughout the day. We will contact parents if their child is displaying COVID symptoms and ask them to carry out a lateral flow/PCR test. Your child will need to remain at home until we have the results before they can return to school. We will be monitoring things daily and following the guidance given to us by Public Health England and the Department for Education. Over the last few weeks, the children have begun practising the songs for our Christmas performance. Next week, each child will be bringing home a copy of the song words to practise at home. We plan to start formal rehearsals next week as well and will be sending home a letter with each child outlining the costume they will need. We ask that all costumes are brought into school by **Monday 6<sup>th</sup> December**, in a named bag, so we can provide opportunities for the children to practise the performance with a dress rehearsal. If you need support with your child/ren's costume, please speak to your child's class teacher or myself and we will be happy to support.

The School Council have been discussing with the other children how they would like to be rewarded for their fantastic behaviour, attitude and efforts with their learning. They have taken two approaches to this; an individual reward, collecting stickers for individual 'yes please' behaviour choices. For every 20 stickers the children collect, they will be awarded a certificate in our celebration assembly and receive a ticket for the class termly draw. Each class will decide what the prize will be which will be linked to an area of the curriculum. The second will be a class reward, something that the whole class will work together to develop. The class will be awarded a marble in the jar each time they work together with everyone demonstrating the class focus. Again, once this is achieved the children will be awarded with some extra playtime.

As well as discussing the rewards with the children in assembly on Monday, we also talked about the sanctions that we have put in place. Children will be given opportunities to think about the 'no thank you' behaviour choices they are making and turn their behaviour to 'yes please'. If they are unable to do this after several warnings, they will be taken to the other class for 10 minutes of reflective time. Once they have completed this, they will fill out a think sheet. With support from the class teacher, the child will be guided with the choices they could make if the situation was to happen again. If a child needs to be removed from the classroom more than three times over a week, the class teacher will arrange a meeting with the child's parents. Please see the flow chart that we have talked through with the children attached to this week's newsletter, these will be displayed around the school.

There are outside lights and enhanced security being put into place following some serious vandalism at the school. Can we ask the community to be vigilant, and report anything they deem suspicious to a member of staff.

On **Monday 6<sup>th</sup> December** we will be holding our parents' forum from **5-6pm**. An agenda for the meeting will be sent out on Monday. Once again, if you would like to speak to myself or your child's class teacher, please talk to us at the gate or arrange an appointment with Mrs Davey in the school office.


