

Dear Parents/Carers

Following announcement of our new leadership team, the children had their first meetings this week and have already begun to action some of their development points. It has been great to see the communication and collaboration between the children and their enthusiasm for the role. The groups have been creating their own action plans, which we will discuss in our meetings next week.

We were excited to welcome parents back into school last week for our first Celebration Assembly and today we opened school for our very first Book and Biscuit session of the year. Reading At Home

Studies show that reading for pleasure makes a big difference to children's educational performance. Likewise, evidence suggests that children who read for enjoyment every day not only perform better in reading tests than those who do not, but also develop a broader vocabulary, increased general knowledge and a better

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understanding of other cultures. We ask that parents continue to support their child/ren by reading at home every night and recording this in their reading record books. Children in Littlemoor class who are following the RWi programme will have a book to practise at home, as well as a book from the library. All other children will have a banded reading book to continue to read, as well as a library book. Children in Oketor class will be supported to choose a book from the school library.

We will continue with our weekly reading basket raffle which will be drawn every Friday in our celebration assembly. Children will have their name entered into the draw for reading 5 times a week and get to take home a selection of gorgeous books, as well as snuggly blankets, hot chocolate and marshmallows! Definitely what is needed as the nights get darker and the weather gets colder.

A Seasonal Celebration for Schools: Pressing Apples and Storytelling

- To advise/act as a critical friend to the principal's
- To advise the Trust Board about local issues they need to consider that might affect the schools
- To represent the interest of the community within the Trust
- To represent the school in its community
- To ensure that each school's co-op identity is supported by listening to the pupils, parents, staff and the local community

Our board can accommodate people with differing desires and skills. Governors do not need to have an education sector background, nor do they necessarily need to have children at one of our schools. In addition to the basic roles above, there are also lead roles available for those with specific interests or skills.
